

#### January 10, 2021

George Sheets called the meeting to order. Devotions were presented by George Sheets. Members present were Mark Ebbeskotte, Mike Geiger, Dan Feichtner, Bob Geiger, Jim Shade, Carl Reinhart, Michele Breyley, Brian Evak, Shawn Auck, Susie Sutherland and George Sheets.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Secretaries report was read by members. Jim moved to accept the minutes; Mike seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> George gave the report: Pastors Discretionary fund \$8,683.56, checking account has \$18,179.31. All the bills are current. Mark made a motion to accept the report, Dan seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Deacon's Report:</u> Brian gave the deacons report. Since the Church has been closed because of COVID-19, there is no count for attendance or communion. There was a total giving for the month of \$24,997.00. Thanksgiving Eve donation were \$690.00, Christmas Eve donations were \$950.00.

<u>Trustee's Report:</u> There is no new business or current problems to discuss.

Elder's Report: Mark reported no issues at this time. It was brought to his attention about the newsletter while we were not at church. We will discuss this further if issue returns. Dan said the ballot for the Annual Meeting is done. He is concerned that many people who have been asked are declining to run. At this rate, it will continue to get harder to fill positions when most of the people who are willing to run are already in an office, or have to wait to run again because they just left a position.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> George said Pastor would not be present because he was not feeling well today.

Michele made a motion to accept above reports. Brian seconded the motion. Reports were approved.

Old Business: There was no old business to be discussed at this time.

New Business: As stated above, the ballot for the Annual Meeting is completed. We finalized the 2021 budget. The treasurer books are due in the office by January 17<sup>th</sup>. We will return to Church on January 24<sup>th</sup> with the Annual Meeting be moved back one Sunday to January 31<sup>st</sup>. The meeting will be right after Church. There will be no lunch due to COVID-19. All Lenten Services will be at 7:00 pm. The Lenten service monies will be distributed as follows: Ash Wednesday – Woman of the Church, Maundy Thursday-Contact Crawford County, Good Friday-American Cancer Society road to Recovery. Wednesday services will be given to Salvation Army and Born divided equally. Confirmation has one student to be Confirmed this year. Confirmation will be on Palm Sunday, March 28<sup>th</sup>.

The next council meeting will be on February 14, 2021. The meeting was closed with the Lord's prayer.
