February 10, 2019

George Sheets called the meeting to order. Devotions were presented by George. Members present were Mark Ebbeskotte, Jim Shade, Carl Rinehart, Doug Ebbeskotte, Eric Kocher, Bob Geiger, Dan Feichtner, Michele Breyley, Pastor Scherner, and Susie Sutherland.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Correction by Dan. He brought to the council's attention about exterior doors needing sealed this year. Bob was going to look into it. Eric moved to accept the minutes with correction, Mark seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Treasurer Report:</u> Bob reported all bills current with exception of Peacock Water bill for parsonage. He is disputing charged amount. Checking account balance is \$63,873.58. Doug moved to accept the report, Eric seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Deacon's Report:</u> Doug reported average attendance of 103 for the month. The Communion count was 101. Total giving is \$13,442.14 for the month, with yearly giving of \$24,003.12. This was for a total of 4 Sundays.

<u>Trustee's Report:</u> Bob reported that elevator passed inspection, and fire extinguishers in the church and parsonage also passed inspection. Doug Bishop will seal exterior doors. He is looking into the doorbell to see what the problem is. Eric will be getting quotes for window work. He also has a bid for carpet cleaning. He will be getting a couple more. Dan reported that we are in need of some new thermostats in the church. The old ones are not made any more so he going to try a new one to see how we like it. Sam reported the speaker in back of church is repaired. He is looking into Pastor and Dave's microphones on getting new ones.

Elder's Report: No concerns to report. All is good.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor presented a log of his hours. There is a conference at First Lutheran in Mansfield sponsored by NALC on "an aging church" that he will be attending.
